Based on Luke 2:1–20



Based on Luke 2:1–20




Scene 1

It was a long and tiring voyage, and Mary was soon to give birth to the baby. Day after day they walked on, until they finally arrived in Bethlehem.




Scene 3

JOSEPH: Let me prepare a place for you.


Scene 8

NARRATOR: That same night, not too far away from the town, shepherds were watching their sheep on the hills. When, suddenly, an angel appeared!




