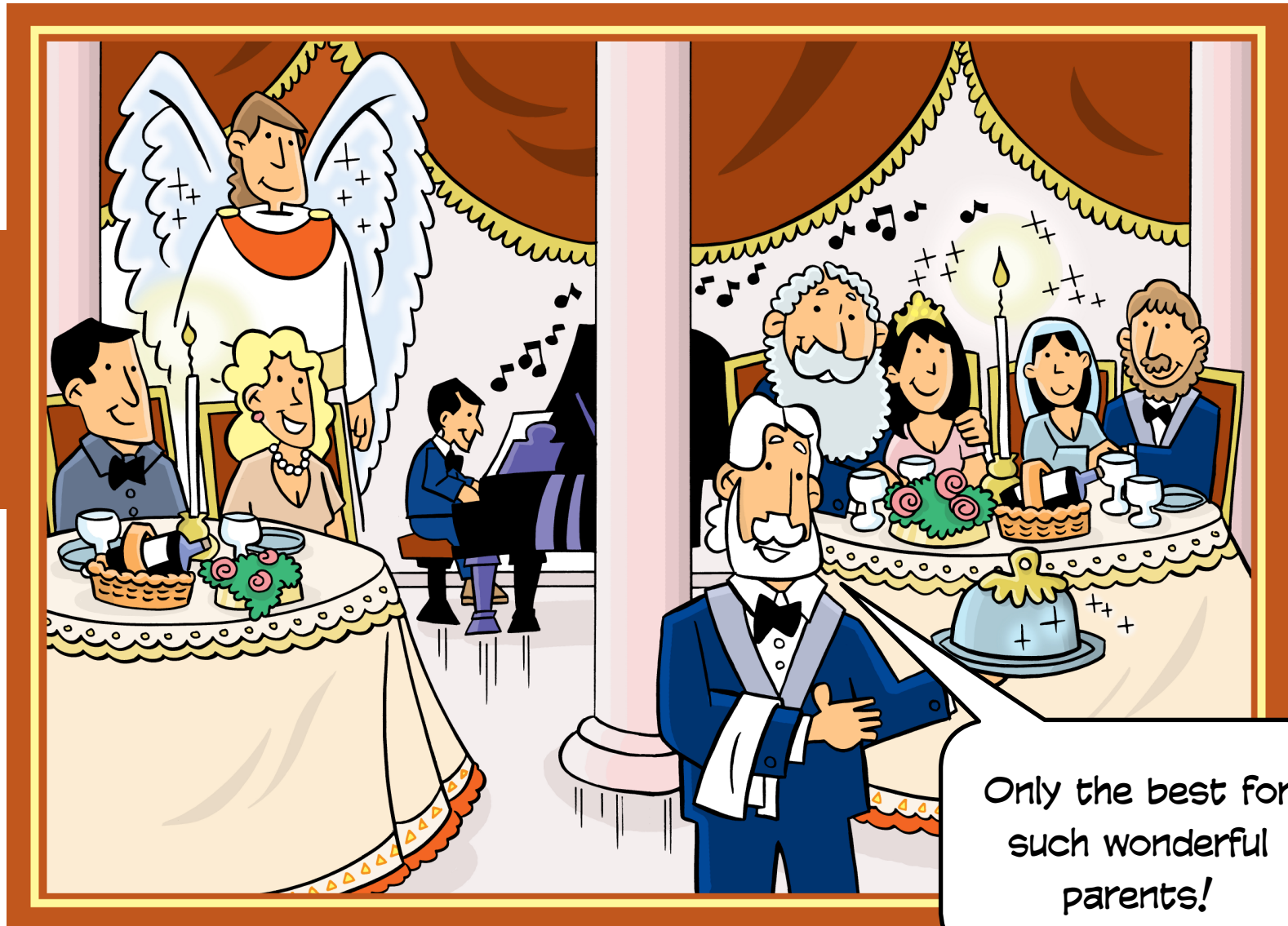


Honor Your Parents

(Ephesians 6:1–2 NIV)

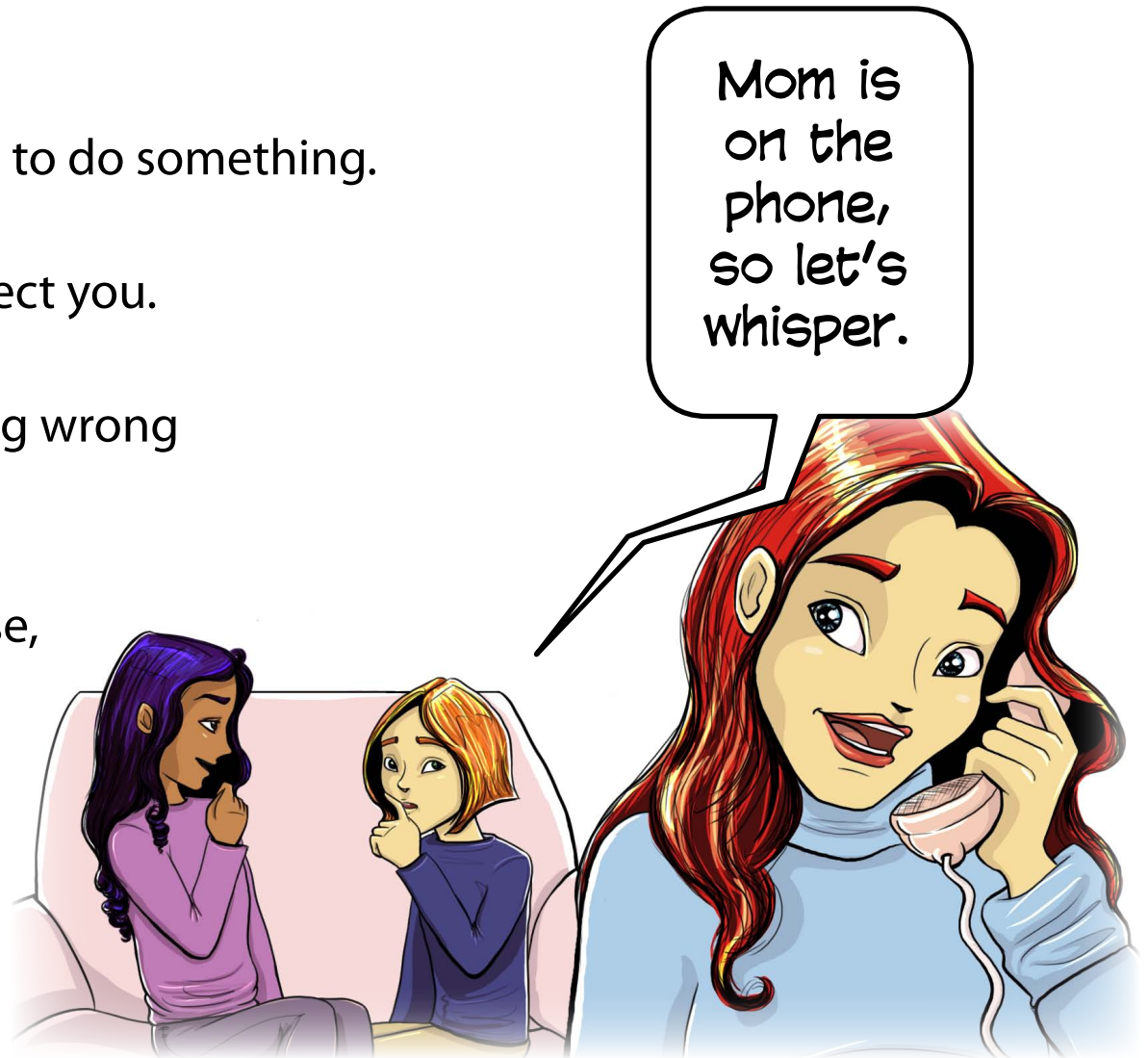
Children, obey your parents in all things: for this pleases the Lord.
