


One of these books is one of the four Gospels, the Gospel According to Luke.








Luke writes about 24 of the parables Jesus told.



Luke's Gospel includes thirteen accounts of Jesus healing people.

Not being one of the twelve apostles, Luke did not write a personal recollection of the record of Jesus' life as did Matthew and John. Instead Luke studied the accounts given by the apostles and all of Jesus' followers, and from his diligent studies gave his account of the life of Jesus.

Read the Gospel According to Luke; you'll find it fascinating!



Luke not only gave us the story of Jesus' life, but he also covered the first stories of the amazing works of the Holy Spirit through the apostles after Jesus departed.

He begins his second book, the Acts of the Apostles, by telling us how Jesus appeared many times to His apostles during a forty-day period after His death and resurrection, culminating in Jesus' ascension.
