EDUCATIONAL VARIETY

HAVE YOU EVER BEEN OFFERED A FOOD YOU'VE NEVER HAD BEFORE, AND YOUR PARENT ENCOURAGED YOU TO TRY IT? PERHAPS, WHEN YOU TRIED THE NEW FOOD, YOU DIDN'T INITIALLY CARE FOR IT. LATER, YOUR PARENT HAD YOU TO TRY IT AGAIN, AND THIS TIME YOU LIKED IT. AS YOU GROW OLDER, YOUR TASTES FOR NEW FOODS DEVELOPS AND CHANGES.

EDUCATION IS LIKE THAT. SOME SUBJECTS WILL BE ONES YOU ARE VERY INTERESTED IN, WHEREAS OTHER SUBJECTS WILL BE ONES THAT, FOR NOW, YOU DON'T ENJOY STUDYING AND MAYBE EVEN WISH YOU DIDN'T HAVE TO.

PERHAPS YOU ENJOY YOUR SCIENCE CLASS BUT WISH YOU DIDN'T HAVE TO LEARN HOW TO WRITE ESSAYS. OR YOU LIKE WRITING, BUT YOU DON'T ENJOY LEARNING TO SPELL. HOWEVER, OFTEN WITH EDUCATION ALL THE DIFFERENT PARTS WORK TOGETHER; FOR EXAMPLE, A SCIENTIST NEEDS TO KNOW HOW TO WRITE IN ORDER TO PRESENT SCIENTIFIC QUESTIONS AND FINDINGS, AND AN AUTHOR OR JOURNALIST NEEDS TO KNOW HOW TO SPELL.

WHETHER IT'S A SUBJECT YOU ENJOY LEARNING OR ONE YOU STRUGGLE WITH, IT'S IMPORTANT TO KEEP AT IT AND TRY YOUR BEST TO LEARN WHAT THE TEACHER IS PRESENTING. DON'T SHY AWAY FROM STUDYING SUBJECTS THAT AREN'T YOUR FAVORITE, BECAUSE ONE DAY THAT SUBJECT THAT SEEMED TOO DIFFICULT OR TOO BORING TODAY COULD TURN OUT TO BE IMPORTANT FOR YOU IN THE FUTURE.
