



The City of Ur

Ur, a city mentioned in the book of Genesis, was located on the mouth of the Euphrates River in ancient Mesopotamia, in what is present-day Iraq. The ruins of the Ziggurat¹ of Ur are still visible to this day.

The city is linked to the biblical patriarch Abraham (Abram), who left Ur with plans to settle in the land of Canaan.² (Abraham was the ancestor of the Hebrew people.)


