Based on Luke 15:1–7 and Matthew 18:10–14.

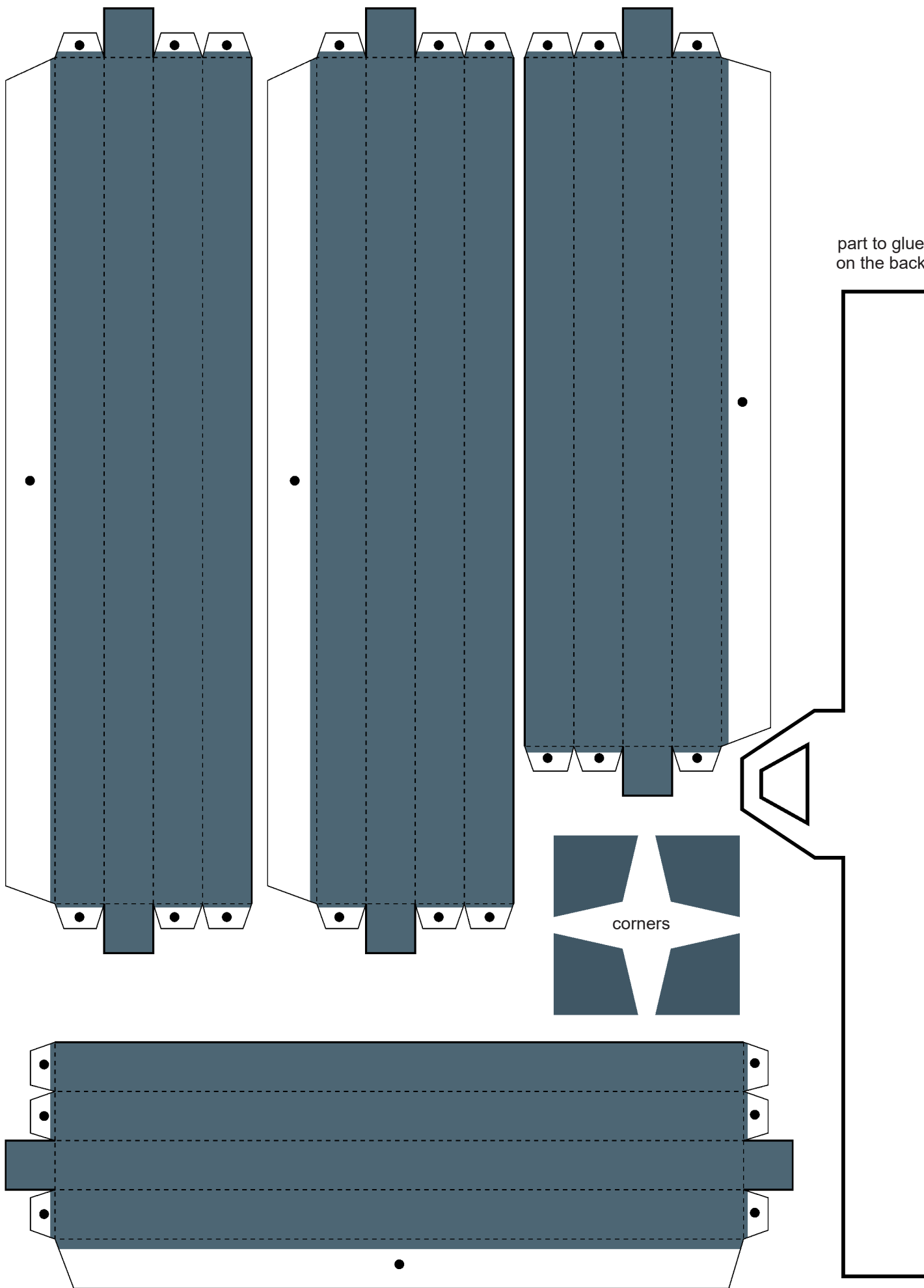
Some tax collectors and outcasts came to listen to Jesus. The Pharisees and scribes started to grumble about them, so Jesus told this parable:

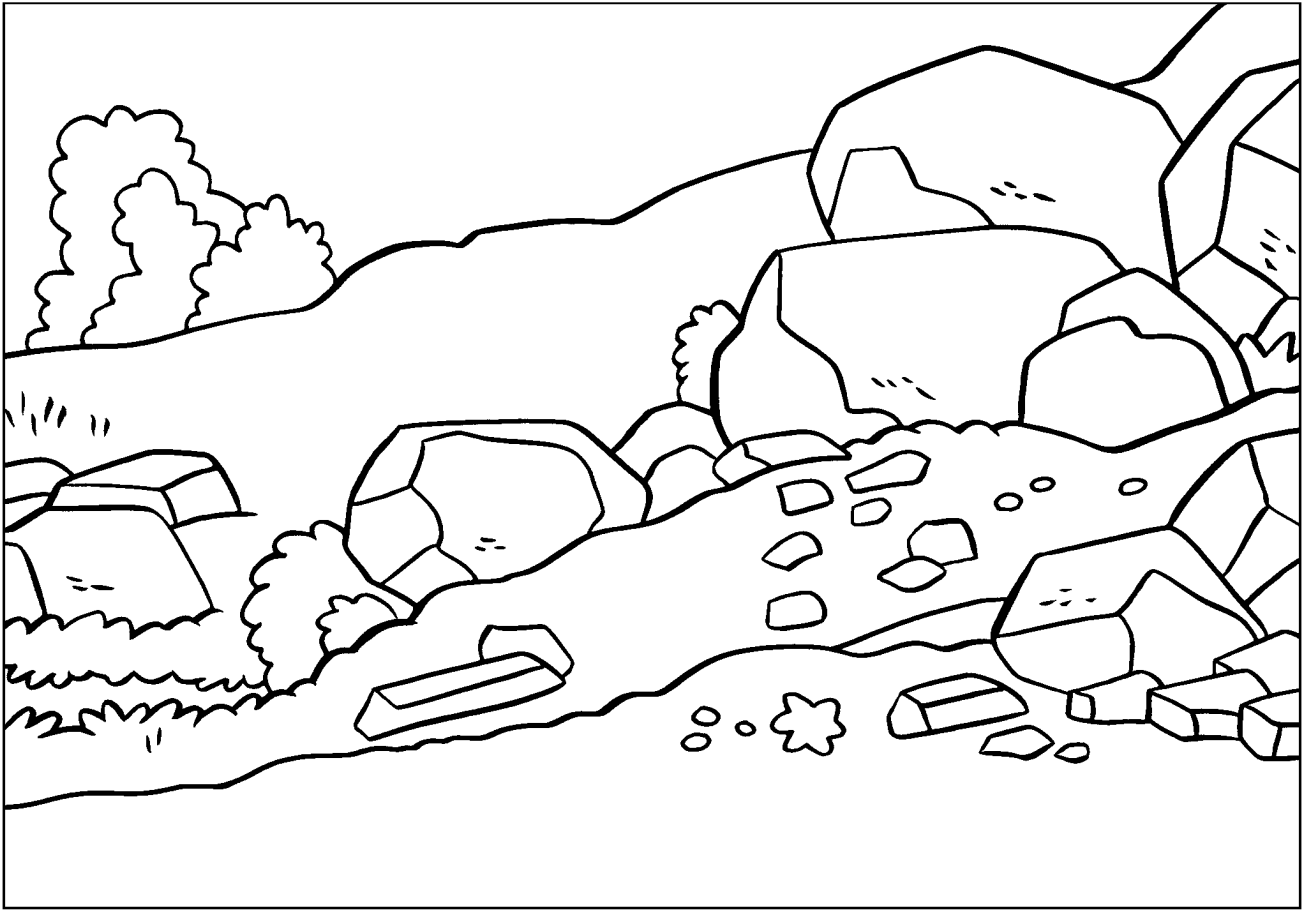
