## JESUS FULLY GOD AND FULLY MAN

Jesus, as the Word, has always been part of God from the beginning.

"Before the world began, the Word was there. The Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was there with God in the beginning. Everything was made through him, and nothing was made without him" (John 1:1–3 ERV).

When Jesus, the Son of God, came to earth as a baby, He became fully human. However, though He was fully human, He also continued to be God.

"The Word became a man and lived among us" (John 1:14 ERV).



We know that Jesus is still human because after He had died and was resurrected, He appeared to some of the women who followed Him, and then later He appeared to some of His disciples, both times in His

recognizable body.

"So the women left the tomb quickly. They were afraid, but they were also very happy. They ran to tell his followers what happened. Suddenly, Jesus was there in front of them. He said, 'Hello!' The women went to him and, holding on to his feet, worshiped him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Don't be afraid. Go tell my followers to go to Galilee. They will see me there'" (Matthew 28:8–10 ERV).



"That same evening the followers were together. They had the doors locked because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders. Suddenly Jesus was standing there in front of them. He said, 'Peace be with you!' As soon as he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. When the followers saw the Lord, they were very happy" (John 20:19–20 ERV).
